- #1 Sale of Assets: From the sale of our mini pumper #142.
- #2 Salaries: Held off on hiring 10th man on one shift to allow for FT Inspector.
- #3 Overtime: There were multiple lost time work and personal injuries; much more than average.
- #4 <u>Training</u>: Due to the injuries causing so much unanticipated overtime use, individuals were not able to be sent to training.
- #5 <u>Repair/Maint. Bldg.:</u> This line item was almost completely used in the first 3 months of the FY 23 due to unanticipated roof AC failure, and many FY 2022 improvements not being finished in time.
- #6 Miscellaneous: 10K overage was the commission paid for the sale of 142, netting 200K.
