#### Request to purchase a mobile radio and portable radio vehicular chargers

01/16/2018

Dear Mayor and City Council,

Please see the following regarding the request to purchase a mobile radio and two portable radio vehicular chargers:

#### Mobile Radios

The Belvidere Fire Department is requesting to purchase a mobile radio to be installed on the new engine. Mobile radios are the radios permanently mounted to the vehicles, whereas portable radios are carried by individuals. Again, we have two mobile radios on each engine; one is VHF, and one is a Starcom. Mobile radios are more powerful than portable radios, therefore they have a larger range. They are used when vehicles are enroute to emergencies. Once on scene, the portable radios are utilized.

The new engine will replace our 1992 Sutphen. The VHF mobile radio on that engine is not working properly. Our mobile radios on our engines are dual-head. There is one head in the cab and one head on the pump panel. The VHF mobile radio rear-head will not transmit. Therefore, instead of repairing (if possible) and installing the existing radio on the new engine with a limited lifespan, we would like to purchase a new mobile radio.

A VHF only mobile radio is \$4,082.25 whereas a dual-band (VHF and Starcom) radio is \$6,538. Purchasing an additional Starcom mobile radio is approximately \$4,400 (didn't get exact quote because it is an impractical option).

The Starcom mobile radio on 150 is nonfunctioning and needs replacement. By purchasing the dual-band radio for the new engine, we can then move the Starcom from 101 and put it on 150. The non-working VHF radio from 101 could be used for parts to help maintain other mobile radios in our fleet.

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#### **Vehicular Chargers**

Motorola discontinued the HT1250 portable radios. Our frontline radios are now APX radios. Our vehicles have a single APX charger and a single HT1250 charger. Often, multiple radios need to be docked for charging. Currently this is not possible. We are requesting the purchase of two gang chargers. One would go on the new engine, and one would be installed on our other frontline engine. The cost of each gang charger is \$505.

The labor quote of \$1,050 includes installing the mobile radio, antenna, and gang charger on the new engine, and installing the gang charger on engine 102.

We are requesting a total of \$8,773.25 to be purchased with Capital Funds.
