City Council,

On Monday, March 7, 2022 the City Council approved the acceptance of a \$15,000 donation. The intent of the donation and anticipated use of the funds was to pay for the purchase of a new Department canine and training for the K-9 handler.

Attached you will find a contract and purchase agreement from F.M. K9 for the purchase of a new canine in the amount of \$7000.00.

In addition, you will find an invoice from Cedar Creek Kennels LLC for a 10-week basic handler course in the amount of \$5,500.00.

Canine Warranty:

- Health guarantee: FM K9 will guarantee canines hips, back, spine and elbows from defect or issue, not related to work or training related injuries for two year's from date of purchase.
- The trainability of the dog is guaranteed for one year from the date of purchase. The warranty will not cover poor training techniques used by purchaser/handler, including abuse or neglect or the poor training or methods of other trainers.

Re: National League of Cities Inclusive Entrepreneurship Program Grant

The City of Belvidere recently partnered with Growth Dimensions to submit an application to the National League of Cities for monies from its City Inclusive Entrepreneurship Program. This is a short-term grant aimed at providing materials, mentorship and outreach to and engagement with Hispanic and Latinix entrepreneurs to start, grow, and sustain their businesses in Belvidere.

Between now and the end of August, Growth Dimensions will partner with the Small Business Development Centers, Rockford Regional Hispanic Chamber of Commerce, and The Workforce Connection to provide materials in English and Spanish and to deliver business education workshops and training in an effort to enhance business opportunities, increase access to capital and position participants to receive grants and loans.

I recommend making a motion to accept \$15,000 in grant funds from the National League of Cities as part of its City Inclusive Entrepreneurship Program as a pass through to Growth Dimensions.

The City of Belvidere lacks a formal spending policy. Traditionally, we have adhered to a procedure where department heads can spend up to \$1,200 without prior council approval if it is for budgeted expenses. The Mayor historically approved, I believe, up to \$2,500.00 without Council approval, obviously only for budgeted expenses.

There are minutes from old meetings in which a spending policy is discussed, however we have never found a comprehensive policy. One exception is the Chief of Police has authority to spend up to \$20,000 with Mayor approval of funds held in the Seized Asset Fund.

Our audit letter has routinely indicated a need for a formal spending policy. Further, a strict reading of Illinois law requires council approval of all expenditures before any expenditure is made, unless that authority is delegated.

As you can imagine, it is essential for any entity to be able to spend limited amounts on routine purchases, so long as it is a budgeted amount, without prior board/council approval. For example, public works routinely purchases fuel for our vehicles (a budgeted amount) prior to formal City Council approval. The Police Department routinely purchases ammunition and other routine products that are budgeted but without specific prior Council approval for the purchase. Even City Hall routinely purchases clerical supplies including pens, paper etc. without prior Council approval (again they are budgeted amounts). Of course, the Council ultimately approves the purchases, through the bills payable process.

I am attaching a table setting forth various discretionary spending limits of some regional municipalities. You will see the limits are not consistent.

I suggest an amendment to the City of Belvidere Municipal Code allowing each department head to expend up to \$2,500.00, for budgeted expenses only, without prior council approval.

Further, I recommend an amendment that would allow the Mayor to expend up to \$15,000.00 for budgeted items without prior Council approval.

Of course, checks and balances still exist. First, the Mayor is already required to review and approve purchase orders. Second, the Council will still see each of the purchases through the bills payable process.

As such, the proposal does not really modify the current practice. Rather, it formalizes the existing process as an ordinance.

Re: Irene Road Realignment Project

In accordance with the recently completed Interchange Development Feasibility Study the Kelly Farms Subdivision includes the realignment of Irene Road from US 20 to the Union Pacific Railroad right-of-way in order to increase traffic capacity by eliminating the two existing 90 degree turns. The budgetary estimate to complete this project is \$1,050,000. Working with the developer, we have identified the following grant opportunities to fund this project:

- 1. IDOT EDP Funds 50% of the cost
- 2. IDOT TARP Funds approximately \$50,000 (based on lane miles and intersections)
- 3. DCEO Grant \$700,000 (to be used for roadway construction and off-site water main extension)

We have received a proposal from CES, Inc to complete the design engineering for the Irene Road Realignment Project in the amount of \$101,120.00. The design engineering includes roadway plans, intersection design study (IDS) and traffic signal plans (as required by IDOT).

I would recommend approval of the proposal from CES, Inc, in an amount not-to-exceed \$101,120.00, to complete the design engineering for the Irene Road Realignment Project. This work will be paid for from capital funds with reimbursement from grant funds.

Re: Dram Shop Insurance

Section 10-79 of the City Liquor Code requires all liquor license holders to maintain dram shop liability insurance. The City modified this provision one year ago. Unfortunately, that revision missed a typographical error that was in the original version. \$1,000,000 was mis-typed as \$1,000.

Recommended Motion: Motion to amend section 10-79 as set forth in the attached draft.

Sec. 10-79. Insurance.

No license or permit shall be issued hereunder unless the applicant files with the application an insurance certificate, issued by an insurance company that is authorized to do business in the state, certifying that the applicant, and the owner of the premises housing the establishment from where the liquor will be sold, has in force and effect liquor liability insurance of not less than \$1,000,000.00 per occurrence and general liability insurance in an amount not less than \$1,000,000.00 per occurrence. "Host" insurance shall not satisfy the terms of this section.
