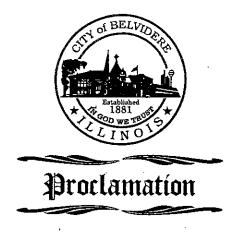

This flare system has been a problem for a long time due to the control panel malfunctioning.
