Ballistic Gear for Paramedics Performing Rescue Operations in the Event of an **Active Shooter**

Dear Mayor Chamberlain and City Council,

Sadly these days, one of the emergencies that we must prepare for is an active shooter. Over the past couple years, the Belvidere Fire Department's paramedics have integrated with the Police Department to be able to provide Rescue Task Force (RTF) Operations in the event of an active shooter. All BFD members are trained to perform these operations. Early medical interventions and trauma care has the potential to save lives. In the past this immediate care would be delayed as paramedics would have been staged away from the incident until the police have cleared the area and deemed it safe for medical personnel. Through post incident reviews of many incidents the response expectations of fire department paramedics have changed. Now we are asking our paramedics to pair up with police and enter in the warm zone immediately after the first arriving officers pass injured victims. We are requesting that our responders have the proper PPE to enter that hostile environment. Proper PPE includes ballistic gear. We are requesting 4 additional sets of ballistic gear to protect the on-duty personnel that would be responding. We have 9 members per shift and minimum on duty manning is 7. Having 8 sets would allow for 4 RTF teams. The total cost of the project is \$6,217.52, to be split with Foreign Fire Insurance Tax Fund (2%).

The 2% Fund has agreed to purchase half of the vests, which have been purchased and are in service. Therefore, to complete the project we are requesting \$3,108.76 for the purchase of 4 sets of ballistic gear. We would use funds in the Account # 01-5-220-6020. Attached are the estimates to buy the remaining 4 sets.

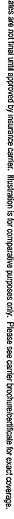

PROFESSIONALSERVICES AGREEMENT between The Lakota Group (Lakota or Consultant) and the City of Belvidere (City)

I. PURPOSE

The purpose of this assignment is to prepare a Phase3 comprehensive survey of the Belvidere Courthouse Square neighborhood in accordance to the stipulations and requirements of Certified Local Government Grant provided by the Illinois Department of Natural Resources.

II. SCOPE OF WORK

The Lakota Team will undertake the following project scope of work for this assignment. In addition, all work described within the City's Request for Proposals for Consultant Services to prepare an Architectural / Historical Intensive Survey of Belvidere's Courthouse Square Phase III Area (the RFP) are included within the scope and manner of the work to be performed under this Agreement and for that purpose, the RFP is incorporated herein by reference.

Task 1: Project Start Meeting (September/October 2019) Meeting #1

Conduct a project start meeting with City/Commission and other stakeholders to introduce Lakota personnel and discuss the following:

- Determine method for identifying survey properties
- Project Work Plan and Schedule
- Project Duties for Lakota and the City/Commission
- Draft Survey Form and Evaluation Criteria
- Research Resources
- Historic Context Information
- Community Engagement Needs and Information Flyer

The Project Work Plan and Schedule will be refined based on input received during the Project Start Meeting. A more specific calendar of meeting and milestone dates will be developed and forwarded to the City. Discussion during the Project Start Meeting will focus on a draft survey form, evaluation criteria, research resources and roles between Lakota and the City. A walking tour around the proposed survey area can also be conducted to determine final survey area boundaries, if needed.

Task 2: Final Survey form (October 2019)

Lakota will prepare a Final Survey Form in consultation with the City/Commission; if desired, consultation with the Illinois State Historic Preservation Office to review the survey form will also be conducted. Apart from a paper version, the Survey Form will also be prepared in an electronic version using the online software.

Task 3: Information Flyer (October 2019) (Optional)

As an optional task, Lakota can develop a well-designed information flyer that could be distributed electronically and/or by paper by the City to inform property owners and the public about the survey process.

Task 4: Context Research (October 2019)

Lakota will initiate property background research to understand the context for their development, including architect(s), developer(s), and contractor(s) known to have played important roles in the construction of Belvidere's buildings.

Task 5: Project Review Conference Call (October) Meeting #2

A conference call with the City and Historic Preservation Commission to review all context research completed to date and to determine additional research and data collection needs. Some aspects of the context research, such as permits, construction dates, known architects and builders, etc., may be inserted in the electronic survey form at this point. The overall Project Schedule may also be adjusted.

Task 6: On-Site Intensive Field Survey (October – December 2019)

An intensive-level on-site inventory of selected properties will be conducted by Lakota.

Task 7: Mapping (December 2019)

Based on completed survey forms and other data, Lakota will prepare a map(s) documenting the location of each property within the larger context of the community and their evaluation rating — whether they are significant, potentially contributing, or non-contributing.

Task 8: Draft Survey Report (January 2020) Deliverable #1

Lakota will prepare a Draft Survey Report which will include all relevant chapters as outlined in the Project Approach.

Task 9: Project Review Conference Call (January 2020) (Meeting #3)

A conference call with the City/Commission to review all completed tasks to date, including the Draft Survey. The overall Project Schedule may also be adjusted at this point.

Task 10: Final Survey Report (February 2020) Deliverable #2

Revised Final Reports will be prepared and delivered to the City of Belvidere. One (1) electronic copy and two (2) hard copies will be delivered as specified by the RFP document.

Task 11: Historic Preservation Commission Meeting (February - March 2020) Meeting #4

Conduct a presentation to the Historic Preservation Commission regarding the project process and methodology, major findings and conclusions drawn from the survey.

Task 12: Community Meeting (March 2020) (Meeting #5)

Conduct a presentation to the community regarding the project process and methodology, major findings and conclusions drawn from the survey.

Task 13: City Council Meeting (November 2019) Visit #5 / Meeting #6 (optional)

Conduct a presentation to the City Council regarding the project process and methodology, major findings and conclusions drawn from the survey

III. TIMELINE

Lakota recognizes that time is of the essence and will complete its obligations under this Agreement within five (5) months of contract execution.

IV. COMPLIANCE WITHLAWS

Lakota shall give notices and comply with laws, ordinances, rules, regulations, and orders of all public authorities applicable to these Services and shall comply with all federal, state, and local tax laws and social security, unemployment compensation and workers compensation acts, including, but not limited to, the Federal Drug Free Workplace Act.

V. EQUAL OPPORTUNITY

Each party represents that it is an equal opportunity employer and will operate to comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws relating to equal employment opportunities, and if required, with the rules or regulations enforced by the Office of Federal Contract Compliance or any similar federal or state agency monitoring employment practices or government contracts.

VI. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This Agreement contains the full understanding of the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof, and it supersedes all prior proposals, agreements, memoranda, statements, and representations, written or oral, between the parties. This Agreement maybeexecuted in several counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original but all of which together shall be deemed to be the same agreement.

VII. CONFIDENTIALITY

No party hereto shall disclose any information of any nature regarding this Agreement, except that either party may make such disclosures as are specifically required by law, including but not limited to the Illinois Freedom of Information Act.

VIII. CONFLICT OF INTEREST

Lakota certifies the no employee or officer of any agency with an interest in the Agreement has any pecuniary interest in the business of the Consultant or this Agreement, nor does any employee or officer have an interest that would conflict in any manner or degree with the Consultant's performance of this Agreement.

IX. GOVERNING LAW

This Agreement shall be governed and interpreted under the laws of the State of Illinois without regard to conflicts of law provisions. Any action, in any way related to this Agreement shall be brought in the Circuit Court for the 17th Judicial Circuit, Boone County, Illinois and the parties hereby consent to the jurisdiction of and venue in that Court.

X. INSURANCE

Lakota and its subcontractors will provide the City of Belvidere with evidence of insurance, reasonably acceptable to the City, including liability, umbrella, and automobile. The City will be named as an additional insured as appropriate to City requirements.

Consultant must carry and maintain at its own cost with such companies as are reasonably acceptable to City all necessary liability insurance (which shall include as a minimum the requirements set forth below) over the course of the proposed project, for damages caused or contributed to by Consultant, and insuring Consultant against claims which may arise out of or result from Consultant's performance or failure to perform the Services hereunder.

The Consultant must provide an insurance certificate naming the City of Belvidere as an additional insured and will provide a variety of insurances including:

- Comprehensive general liability \$1,000,000 combined single limit for each occurrence for bodily injury and property damage - designating the City as Additional Insured
- Workers Compensation Statutory limits
- Automobile Liability \$1,000,000 per occurrence for all claims arising out of bodily injuries or death and property damages.
- Errors and omissions or professional liability insurance \$1,000,000

Consultant's certificate of insurance shall contain a provision that the coverage afforded under the policy(s) will not be canceled or reduced without thirty (30) days prior written notice (hand delivered or registered mail) to City.

The Consultant, including their subcontractor, employees representatives or agents shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless the City of Belvidere, its officers, employees and agents for any and all liability loss, cost, damage and expense (including reasonable attorney's fees and court costs) resulting from, arising out of, or incurred by reason of any claims, actions or suits based upon or alleging bodily injury including death, or property damage rising out or resulting from the Consultant's operations under thisdocument.

XI. SEVERABILITY

The provisions of this Agreement are severable and the invalidity or unenforceability of any provision of this Agreement shall not affect the validity or enforceability of any other provision. In addition, if any provision of this Agreement (or portion thereof) is determined by a court to be unenforceable as drafted by virtue of the duration, scope, extent, or character of any obligation contained herein, the parties acknowledge that it is their intention that such provision (or portion thereof) shall be construed in a manner designed to effectuate the purposes of such provision to the maximum extent enforceable under applicable law.

XII. TERMINATION

For any reason, the Agreement may be terminated in whole or in part by the City upon written notice to Lakota. The City may pay Lakota's costs actually incurred as of the date of receipt of notice of default. Lakota may terminate this Agreement upon thirty (30) days' notice to the City for the City's failure to pay compensation or costs when due. Upon termination, Lakota will deliver all documents and products of whatever kind, and their reproducible origins related to the assignment, which have been produced to the date of the notice of termination.

XIII. INVOICING

Lakota shall submit monthly invoices to the City, and each invoice shall be subject to the audit and approval of the City. Invoices will be accompanied by receipts for all reimbursable expenses and shall be itemized and detailed as to the type/date of the services/tasks performed. All payments will be made in accordance with the Illinois Local Government Prompt Payment Act.

XIII. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR STATUS

The relationship of Consultant to City is that of independent contractor, and nothing in this agreement is intended nor shall be construed to create an agency, employment, joint venture relationship, or any other relationship allowing City to exercise control or direction over the manner or method by which Consultant or its subcontractors provide services hereunder. As an independent contractor, Consultant is responsible for the payment of any and all, federal, state, or local, income, sales, use and/or similar taxes.

Neither the City nor any of its employees shall have any control over the manner, mode or means by which Consultant, its agents, or employees, perform the services required herein, except as otherwise set forth herein. The City shall have no voice in the selection, discharge, supervision or control of Consultant's employees, servants, representatives, or agents, or in fixing their number, compensation, or hours of service. The Consultant shall not at any time or in any manner represent that it or any of its agents or employees are agents or employees of City. The City shall not in any way or for any purpose become or be deemed to be a partner of Consultant in its business or otherwise or a joint venture or a member of any joint enterprise with Consultant

All of the reports, information, data, etc., prepared or assembled by the Consultant under this agreement are confidential and the Consultant agrees that they shall not be made available to any individual or organization without the prior written approval of the City. All such reports, information data, etc. prepared for or on behalf of the City shall become the property of the City and Consultant specifically waives all rights and interest to such reports, information and data, including but not limited to any copyright or other interests.

XIV. PROJECT TERMS

Lakota and its sub-consultants will be compensated with a not-to-exceed fee of budget <u>\$13,986</u> including all <u>approved</u> reimbursable expenses.

The project fee includes all the meetings and deliverables outlined in the Scope of Work. It does not include any additional meetings, project reviews, presentations, studies, plans or designs other than those outlined in Section II: Scope of Work. The parties may, only by prior written agreement, expand the Scope of Work which may result in additional fees or expenses.

XV. NOTICES
